Down on the farm ...

Well, it's pumpkin time again and we can't quite believe another year has gone by!

A lot has happened down on the farm and in the services so here's a quick overview on what's been going on.........

We have a newbie attending Day services – Seb Page. Seb started attending the farm in July and has soon settled into the team and really getting stuck into the daily workload of animal husbandry and produce tendering.







We have had an abundant harvest of seasonal vegetables all thanks to the day services team and especially Fay (our chair of Trustees and 'trusty' volunteer). Fay spends many hours planning out what will be planted in the raised beds and polytunnel and keeps everyone organized and motivated on the produce side of the farm. Fay said 'We have planted some spring greens in the polytunnel and also plan to grow onions in there soon as well as garlic. The butternut squash are very late but we still have a few to look forward to. We have at least 20 good sized pumpkins, the cucumbers are still producing and green manure (mustard) sown to keep the weeds down over winter and enrich the soil.' Fay is ably assisted by Juliet (our ex admin officer) and our newest volunteer Jane, who joined us in August.

On the animal side of the farm, the baby peacocks/hens continue to grow and grow and soon they will be ready for a bigger enclosure to be built. I'm sure everyone that attends Day services will enjoy that project. We have had some huge dragonflies flying around the pond in the tranquility garden and an Elephant Hawk Caterpillar was found on the grapevine. These excellent photo's were taken by Julie.
